

She is the author of the award-winning volume *The Women's Fight: The Civil War's Battles for Home, Freedom, and Nation.* She is also the author of *Out of the House of Bondage: The Transformation of the Plantation Household.* Glymph is currently completing a book manuscript titled "African American Women and Children Refugees in the Civil War.
